Dear Acting Secretary Fink and Acting Administrator Wu,

We write to you today to express our concern regarding the recent action taken on January 20, 2025, by President Donald Trump to rescind Executive Order 14087, Lowering Prescription Drug Costs for Americans.

Executive Order 14087, issued by former President Joe Biden, created a pathway for the development and evaluation of new healthcare payment and delivery models through the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services. These innovative models were designed to lower drug costs, promote innovation, and increase access to diverse therapies and treatment options.

The former Administration worked collaboratively across the agency to identify three model concepts that would accomplish these objectives:

- Medicare \$2 Drug List Model
- Cell and Gene Therapy Access Model
- Accelerating Clinical Evidence Model

These concept models were designed to enhance the prescription drug provisions in the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022. Over 40 external stakeholders evaluated these model options under the direction of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' Center for Medicaid and Medicare Innovation, taking into account their ability to meet the strategic priorities of the Administration and the needs of the American people. Each model holds significant potential to address affordability, equity, and access to critical treatments. Understand that 3 in 10 adults report not taking prescribed medicine at some point in the past year due to the rising costs.¹ In addition, brand prescription drugs are consistently rising faster than the rate of inflation making it difficult for Americans to choose between their health and other household expenses.² The revocation of this Executive Order will jeopardize these initiatives and obstruct the advancement of healthcare equity.

Therefore, we the undersigned seek clarification on the impact of President Donald Trump's Executive Order, rescinding Executive Order 14087, and ask the Secretary of Health and Human Services to provide answers to the following:

3. What initiatives will be implemented to address gaps in access to innovative therapies that impact vulnerable communities?



Thank you in advance for your attention to this matter. We look forward to your response.


