A BILL

To extend the financial disclosure requirements of subchapter I of chapter 131 of title 5, United States Code, to certain special Government employees, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ending DOGE Con-
5 flicts Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENTS FOR, AND PROHIBITIONS ON, CER-**
2 **TAIN SPECIAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon the date of the enactment
4 of this Act, any special Government employee (as that
5 term is defined in section 202 of title 18, United States
6 Code) who is the owner, controlling shareholder, or chief
7 executive officer of a company contracted with the Federal
8 Government shall, in addition to the officers and employ-
9 ees described under section 13103(f) of title 5, United
10 States Code, be subject to the requirements of subchapter
11 I of chapter 131 of such title (relating to financial disclo-
12 sures).

13 (b) REVIEW AND COMPLIANCE.—For purposes of
14 section 13108 of title 5, United States Code, any reporting
15 requirement incumbent upon a special Government em-
16 ployee described in subsection (a) shall be transmitted to
17 the Director of the Office of Government Ethics, who shall
18 be responsible for the review and certification of such re-
19 port.

20 (c) INTERIM PROHIBITION.—Until the date on which
21 the initial report required under subchapter I of chapter
22 131 of title 5, United States Code, has been certified as
23 compliant pursuant to subsection (b), a special Govern-
24 ment employee described in subsection (a) is prohibited
25 from carrying out any official duties relating to employ-
26 ment with the Federal Government.
