



The House Republican funding bill cuts services for veterans, families, and seniors, including **\$15.9 million in Community Project Funding** that was previously approved by the House Appropriations Committee for Connecticut's First District:

- **\$3 million** for the **City of Bristol Fire and Police Department** to construct an active shooter training facility and indoor police firing range.
- **\$2.5 million** for the **Town of East Hartford** to improve portions of the Hockanum Linear Park Trail that have faced significant flooding.
- **\$2 million** for the **Town of East Hartford** to upgrade streetlights and make pedestrian improvements along Main Street.
- **\$1.25 million** for the **City of Hartford** to connect Market Street to Edwards Street with the Hartline car-free greenway.
- **\$1.2 million** for the **Harriott Community Healthcare Academy** to expand certified nursing assistant training and certification programs in East Granby and New Hartford.
- **\$500,000** for **Mothers United Against Violence** to assist victims of gun violence and their families as they navigate the criminal justice system.
- **\$1,105,800** for the **Southington Water Department** to treat PFAS forever chemicals in wells that serve approximately 43,000 residents.
- **\$550,000** for **Our Piece of the Pie** to strengthen crime prevention measures among aged-out foster youth, transitional aged youth, at-risk youth and disconnected young adults.
- **\$350,000** for **CONNSTEP** to support offshore wind projects and fuel cell and energy markets across the State of Connecticut.
- **\$850,000** for the **Town of East Hartford** to replace East Hartford's obsolete Fire Station 2.
- **\$500,000** for the **City of Hartford** to renovate Hartford Public Library's (HPL) downtown location, which experienced catastrophic water damage in December 2022.
- **\$850,000** for **Goodwin University** to construct Goodwin University Educational Services' (GUES) CTRA Magnet Middle School.
- **\$1,184,000** for the **Connecticut Center for Advanced Technology (CCAT)** to obtain additive manufacturing (AM) equipment and supporting technology for an AM workforce training/research lab and program.
- **\$26,500** for the **Town of Hartland** to complete the renovation of the Nellie B. West building at Camp Alice Merritt which is used for public meetings, senior and town activities.
