Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,


I am requesting funding for the East Granby Granbrook Park Repair project for fiscal year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is Town of East Granby, located at 9 Center Street, East Granby, CT 06026. The funding would be used to upgrade Granbrook Park's infrastructure, expand programming for seniors and children, and create new public facilities, allowing town residents to better utilize the park.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds as it will enhance capacities of outdoor community programming for residents from pre-school to senior citizens. Renovations to the 30-years-old playscape will allow the town to hold senior outings and host its youth Summer Camp program in the park again, which was not feasible for the last 2 years due to loss of the park's drinking water source. Dozens of town and board meetings illustrate the local desire for repairing the park, and funding for this project will enable the town to better meet its residents' needs.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is consistent with purposes authorized in 42 U.S.C.5305(a)(1), 5305(a)(2), 5305(a)(4), and/or 5305(a)(5).
