RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President of the United States to furnish certain information to the House of Representatives relating to access to and usage of NUMIDENT, death information, and other personally identifiable information in the possession of the Social Security Administration by an individual acting for or on behalf of the Department of Government Efficiency.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the President of the United States is
- 2 requested to furnish the House of Representatives, not
- 3 later than 14 days after the date of adoption of this reso-

1 lution, copies of any document, record, audio recording,
2 memorandum, call log, correspondence (electronic or oth-
3 erwise), audit trails and audit logs, written agreements,
4 or other communication in his possession, or any portion
5 of any document, record, audio recording, memorandum,
6 call log, correspondence (electronic or otherwise), or other
7 communication, that refers or relates to the following:

8 (1) Numerical Identification System (hereafter
9 referred to as “NUMIDENT”) information, death
10 information, and other personally identifiable infor-
11 mation in the possession of the Social Security Ad-
12 ministration which an individual acting for or on be-
13 half of the Department of Government Efficiency
14 (hereafter referred to as “DOGE”) reportedly dupli-
15 cated onto a personal thumb drive or other personal
16 electronic device.

17 (2) Reported efforts by an individual acting for
18 or on behalf of DOGE to share with the individual’s
19 private sector employer the NUMIDENT informa-
20 tion, death information, and other personally identi-
21 fiable information duplicated from the Social Secu-
22 rity Administration onto a personal thumb drive or
23 other personal electronic device.

24 (3) Reported statements by an individual acting
25 for or on behalf of DOGE regarding expectations of

1 receiving a presidential pardon if actions with re-
2 spect to personally identifying information in the
3 possession of the Social Security Administration
4 were deemed to be illegal.
