Dear Speaker Mike Johnson,


I write to demand, that in light of the recent murders of Alex Pretti and Renee Nicole Good at the hands of federal immigration enforcement officials and a looming government shutdown, that you call the House of Representatives back into session, to prepare legislative action to rein in rogue immigration enforcement, and avert a government shutdown that will hurt the American people.

The escalating violence perpetrated by federal agents under Kristi Noem's command must be addressed by this Congress. It is clear that the package of Appropriations bills that were passed by the House last week does not have the support of the Senate. With six government funding bills due to expire at 11:59 p.m. on January 30th, the House must return to Washington D.C. Failing to do so is a dereliction of duty, guaranteeing a government shutdown and failing to rein in out-of-control federal agents

By failing to return, we will be stripping air traffic controllers, TSA agents, and active-duty military servicemembers of their paychecks and jeopardizing key government operations, including the prompt processing of tax returns. I also call on you to pass **H.R. 5802**, the [Make America Govern Again Act](#) to ensure that those federal employees are guaranteed their pay during a shutdown, while elected officials like you and I forgo our paychecks until the government is reopened.

You have the opportunity to do what is in the best interests of the American people by taking action to rein in out-of-control immigration enforcement officers and keep our government open for the American people.
