



Manchester – Federal Funding Snapshot

Total Funding: Over \$73.1 million

American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) Funding:

- The Town of Manchester has received more than **\$40.4 million** in **ARP** funding for local priorities, including:
 - **\$150,000** in rental payment assistance for eligible residents
 - A new social worker with the Manchester Police Department
 - A homelessness outreach by the Manchester Area Conference of Churches (MACC)
 - **\$3.9 million** for Human Services & Public Safety
 - **\$6.0 million** for Town Operations and Services
 - **\$3.88 million** for Parks and Recreation
 - **\$1.2 million** for Economic Development
 - **\$10 million** for Town Facilities and Community Infrastructure

Community Project Funding:

- **\$3,000,000** for Laurel Marsh Trail Improvements
- **\$850,000** for Manchester's Downtown for All project

Federal Grants:

- **\$1.1 million** Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF) to purchase laptops and internet equipment for students
- **\$400,000** Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (SVOG)

- **\$4 million** in Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) grants for **19** Manchester restaurants
- Manchester Fire Department;
 - **\$100,000** Assistance to Firefighters grant (AFG) for operations and safety training
- Manchester Community College
 - **\$145,258** for Humanities Initiatives at Community Colleges
- Prospect Manchester Hospital
 - **\$14,447** in Emergency Head Start funding
- Manchester Board of Education;
 - **\$8.4 million** grant from the Department of Health and Human Services for the town's HeadStart program (including \$1.3 million secured in 2025)
- Manchester Housing Authority
 - **\$899,732** Public Housing Repair Fund award to improve and rehabilitate public housing units
 - **\$5,756,426** from the Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCV) to increase access to affordable housing.

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA):

- **\$2.2 million** for Safety Imp @Oakland/Woodbridge
- **\$5 million** to Rehab Br 06650 Culvert
- **\$3.3 million** to Rehab Br 06884 & 06885
- **\$2 million** for LRARP Intersection Improvements
- **\$2.8 million** for Wrong Way Signs with Flashers
