

Windsor – Federal Funding Snapshot

Total Funding: Over \$26.1 million

American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) Funding

- The Town of Windsor has received more than **\$13.3 million** in **ARP** funding for local priorities, including:
 - Competitive Economy
 - \$626,000 for Small Business & Nonprofit Grants
 - **\$285,000** for School to Business Connection
 - \$520,000 for Workforce Development Municipal Apprenticeship Prog.
 - \$150,000 for Small Business Incubator & Support Center
 - Safe, Strong, Diverse Neighborhoods & Families
 - \$1,150,000 for Housing Rehab & Energy Efficiency Programs, Caring Connection Operating Grant, and Windsor Volunteer Ambulance Grant
 - Community Health & Wellness
 - \$490,000 for Mental Health, Wellness, and Fitness services
 - Capital Investment Allocation
 - \$5,130,000 for Neighborhood Park Enhancements and Wilson Gateway Park
 - \$8,500,000 so far

Community Project Funding FY23:

• Town of Windsor: Broad Street Complete Streets Improvement \$3,000,000

Federal Grants:

- **\$1.9 million** in Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) grants for 9 Windsor restaurants
- **\$3,000** to Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF) grant to Madina Academy to purchase laptops and internet equipment for students
- \$46,000 Battlefield Interpretation Grant for CRIS Radio
- **\$323,230** for Sirona Medical Technologies Inc. to conduct heart and vascular disease research
- **\$5 million** Mental Health and Substance Abuse Service Grant to Community Health Resources
- <u>The Windsor Fire Department;</u>
 - \$14,250 Assistance to Firefighters Grant from FEMA to purchase protective clothing and advanced communication technology.
- <u>Community Health Resources Inc;</u>
 - \$125,000 Drug Free Communities Support grant from the Department of Health and Human Services to fight youth and young adult drug use.
- <u>The National Organization of Sisters of Color Ending Sexual</u> <u>Assault;</u>
 - \$350,000 Family Violence Prevention and Services Act grant from the Department of Health and Human Services to support their domestic violence education and support services.
- <u>Shad Run Terrace;</u>
 - \$2 million Small Cities Community Development Block
 Grant to install new energy-efficient windows and doors for residents, as well as new vinyl siding

- **\$1,413,937** from the Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCV) to the Windsor Housing Authority to increase access to affordable housing.
- Housing Rehabilitation Program
 - \$400,000 to go towards the rehabilitation of 10 low and moderate income resident homes.
